



Cedar County Board Minutes



July 10, 2018

The Cedar County Commissioners met in the Boardroom of the Cedar County Courthouse at 8:30 am and the meeting was called to order as advertised, with Craig Bartels, David McGregor and Terry Pinkelman answering roll call. Also, present County Clerk David Dowling. Chairman McGregor stated the open meetings laws are posted on the wall for public inspection.

Motion was made by Pinkelman and seconded by Bartels to approve the agenda. Motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Motion was made by Bartels and seconded by Pinkelman to approve the minutes from the last meeting. Motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote.

Dave Sudbeck presented a building permit for Dan Thoene for a 16 x 24 storage shed and a motion was made by Pinkelman and seconded by McGregor to approve. Motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Next Sudbeck presented a building permit from Lyle Lammers for 300 feet of feed bunk. Motion was made by McGregor and seconded by Pinkelman. Motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Next a permit from Raleigh Burbach was reviewed for a machine shed. The board stated the property will need to be inspected before the permit can be approved. Sudbeck then stated the wind energy group wants to meet with us Thursday at 11 AM.

Road Supt., Carla Schmidt reported on the precinct 9 road that is proposed to be closed. Schmidt presented a letter to the board to recommend the road to be closed. The board directed Schmidt to contact the County Attorney and advertise and notify adjacent land owners and schedule a hearing for closing the road. Carla presented a sample county line agreement for review and asked the board to make changes if they see a need for any. Carla asked each district to update property list for the required inventory list and insurance list.

County Treasurer, Jean Wiebelhaus presented a list of pledged securities and also made a report to the board on uncollected taxes. Wiebelhaus stated last year's taxes are collected at 99.9 percent and the current year is at 65.7 percent, but second half is not delinquent until September 1st so that percentage is a little above normal.

Clerk of District Court, Janet Wiechelman met with the board to discuss a recent letter from the County Judge regarding attorney fees. Wiechelman stated Judge Vaughan has signed an agreement increasing the fees from 75 dollars an hour to 95 dollars an hour for court appointed attorneys.

At 10:30 bids were opened for a siren in Belden. Two bids were received and reviewed with EMS manager Kevin Garvin. One bid from Blue Valley Public Safety from Greenville Missouri at \$28,804.28 and another bid from Schmader Electric of West Point at \$24,301.00. Motion was made by Commissioner Bartels to accept the bid from Schmader Electric from West Point at \$24,301.00. Motion was seconded by Commissioner Pinkelman. Motion carried with Commissioners Bartels, Pinkelman and McGregor voting in favor of the motion.

Discussion was held on the severe weather that has occurred in Cedar County and the amount of road damage that it has caused and the county board chairman signed a declaration of disaster on June 26th based on the recommendation of the Cedar County Emergency Manager. Kevin Garvin stated that today at 2:30, FEMA will meet with him and the board chairman along with the Road Supt., Carla Schmidt on a preliminary assessment of the damage.

At noon the meeting was recessed for lunch, at 1PM the meeting reconvened with all members present. A motion was then made by McGregor and seconded by Pinkelman to go into board of equalization. Motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Present were commissioners Bartels, McGregor and Pinkelman; also present were assessor Don Hoelsing and county clerk David Dowling. Assessor Hoelsing presented the following parcels on omitted personal property for approval to be added to the tax roll. Motion was made by Pinkelman and seconded by Bartels to approve the omitted list as presented on parcels 2246, 4143, 6106, 6766, 6886, 6975, 6989, 6992, 7011, 7019, 7020, 7022, 7048, 7053, 7067, 7069, 7072, and 7074. Motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. The first protestor was Melvin Heimes protesting parcel 1221.00. Information was reviewed as presented with county assessor. The following protests were reviewed with no testimony from the property owners. Motion was then made by commissioner Bartels and seconded by McGregor to deny protests on parcels 1987, 2163, 2855.01, 735 and 6244. Motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Motion was made by Pinkelman and seconded by Bartels to have assessor make an adjustment on parcel 1221. Motion carried with 3 to 0 vote. Motion was made by McGregor and seconded by Bartels to have assessor make an adjustment on parcel 1971. Motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Motion was made by McGregor and seconded by Bartels to have assessor make adjustment to parcel 828. Motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Motion by McGregor and seconded by Bartels to adjourn as board of equalization and reconvene back into regular session.

The Cedar County Commissioners met in the Boardroom of the Cedar County Courthouse at 8:30 am and the meeting was called to order as advertised, with Craig Bartels, David McGregor and Terry Pinkelman answering roll call. Also present County Clerk David Dowling. Chairman McGregor stated the open meetings laws are posted on the wall for public inspection.

Motion was made by Pinkelman and seconded by Bartels to approve the agenda. Motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Motion was made by Bartels and seconded by Pinkelman to approve the minutes from the last meeting. Motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote.

Road Supt., Carla Schmidt presented a resolution for project STWD-CBMP (1) which is shared Wayne County. Motion by Bartels and seconded by McGregor to sign resolution 18-4 and all voting in favor; motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Motion by McGregor and seconded by Pinkelman to sign and approve resolution 18-5 to proceed with a road closing in precinct nine. Motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Discussion was held on getting the inventory updated on equipment and vehicles.

Peggy Leiting representing Randolph library and Tami Anderson representing Hartington library met with the board to discuss library service within the county presenting information on the service that is being provided to residents within the county. Peggy and Tami both thanked the commissioners for the past support and asked that the board continue with support, so the programs being offered can be continued. They stated that if the board of commissioners can provide the same amount as last year they would greatly appreciate it. The board agreed to the request and stated the same amount will be budgeted again this year for the libraries.

At 10AM engineering proposals were reviewed with three engineering firms for a flood damage project in Cedar County. Proposals were for engineering a repair on a road slide caused from recent storms. Motion was made by McGregor and seconded by Bartels to accept the bid from Maineli Wagner and Associates Engineering firm for the project. Motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote.

Dave Sudbeck presented a building permit for Ed Arens for a 48 x 98 storage shed. Motion by Pinkelman and seconded by McGregor to approve and the motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Next permit was from Gary Kavanaugh for an addition on his house. Motion was made by Bartels and seconded by McGregor; motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Next permit was from Keith Sudbeck for a 50 x 30 garage. Motion was made by McGregor and seconded by Bartels to approve the permit; motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Next permit was from Tim Schroeder for a small grain bin. Motion was made by Pinkelman and seconded by McGregor to approve the permit; motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Next permit was from Chad Kaiser for a 60 x 80 building. Motion was made by Pinkelman and seconded by McGregor to approve the permit; motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Next permit was from Floyd Schmidt for a 12 x 30 storage shed. Motion was made by Pinkelman and seconded by McGregor to approve the permit; motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote. Next permit was from Circle E Livestock and Grain for 2300 feet of feed bunk. Motion was made by Bartels and seconded by McGregor; motion carried with a 3 to 0 vote.

Carla Schmidt presented information from Dept. of Roads that they will be working on Hwy 12 North to the Vermillion Bridge on the 20th of August. Schmidt presented underground permits for District Two and District Three for review and approval. Permits were approved and signed by each respective commissioner for the district. Carla then presented information on the Missouri National Recreational River Alert Signage and River Access Plan and asked the board to sign a letter of support in order to possibly obtain support on the Brooky Bottom boat ramp and road. Schmidt said they are considering this because of the location and to access Goat Island. Motion was made by Pinkelman and seconded by McGregor to sign the letter of support. Motion carried with commissioners Bartels, McGregor and Pinkelman voting in favor of the motion.

Mark Simpson and Sandy Stockholm representing MSAG dealing with sedimentation in the Missouri river and have been visiting entities that have been members of the group. Simpson stated they are working on sedimentation plans for the Lewis & Clark Lake and said sedimentation collection sites are planned to be used in the Niobrara River and the collection of sand can be used for various other projects. Sandy stated they are looking at the 1179a grant application process to get funds for the sedimentation group. Motion was made by Pinkelman and seconded by Bartels to give a letter of support committing a contribution of \$5,000.00 the same as Knox County contribution for the sedimentation project and grant application. Motion carried with commissioners Bartels, McGregor and Pinkelman voting in favor of the motion.

Janet Wiechelman presented a contract with HHS for a cooperative agreement, which also includes child support collections. Motion was made by McGregor and seconded by Pinkelman to grant the Clerk of District Court authority to sign the agreement.

Nebraska Department of noxious weeds representative, Dave Boschult met with the board to present reports and requirements for the county. The score for Cedar County is 3034 from a possible 3400. Boschult stated there is only one open noxious weed report in Cedar County.

Emergency management procedures were discussed and a motion was made by McGregor and seconded by Bartels to grant Emergency Manager, Kevin Garvin permission to draft and release request for hazardous mitigation grants. Motion carried with commissioners Bartels, McGregor and Pinkelman voting in favor of the motion.

Motion was made by Pinkelman and seconded by Bartels to approve an additional one percent for restricted funds in preparing the budget for the 2018 – 2019 fiscal year and to accept and approve tax requests and preliminary levies from the county's subdivisions. Motion carried with commissioners Bartels, McGregor and Pinkelman voting in favor of the motion.

Monthly reports from the Sheriff and Clerk of District Court were reviewed as presented to the board from the previous month.

Jean Wiebelhaus met with the board to discuss distress warrants which 28 of the 31 on the list have been collected.

With further business or agenda items the following claims were signed for payment and the meeting was declared adjourned by chairman McGregor.

Procurement Policy Cedar

County Nebraska

It shall be the policy of Cedar County Nebraska that the County will follow the Nebraska County Purchasing Act as set forth in Nebraska Statute, specifically 23-3101 through 23-3115 specifically as listed below.

Except as provided in section [23-3109](#), purchases of personal property or services by the county board, elected official, appointed official and/or purchasing agent shall be made:

- (a) Through the competitive sealed bidding process prescribed in section [23-3111](#) if the estimated value of the purchase is fifty thousand dollars or more;
- (b) By securing and recording at least three informal bids, if practicable, if the estimated value of the purchase is equal to or exceeds ten thousand dollars, but is less than fifty thousand dollars; or
- (c) By purchasing in the open market if the estimated value of the purchase is less than ten thousand dollars.
- (d) For items over two thousand dollars in estimated value, a minimum of two quotes from different vendors shall be obtained

Whenever the dollar amounts or procedures are changed in Nebraska Statute, the County Policy shall automatically be changed to match the dollar amounts specified by law.

The County Conflict of Interest Policy shall apply to all purchases made.

In the event of purchases made utilizing Federal Grant funds, Federal Funding or Disaster Funding, Cedar County is obligated to follow the more strict procurement rules in effect at that time in the event that State or Federal Procurement rules do not align with the County Policy. 2CFR200 is the governing Federal procurement rules in effect at the time this policy is written.

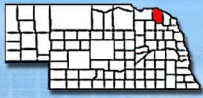
